The launch will be conducted in Khmer.

The Human Rights Education Platform aims to increase knowledge among Cambodian urban youths on key human rights issues in Cambodia through an online interactive platform. By increasing access to human rights education and fostering interest in human rights, the platform will help increase demand for social change in Cambodia. CCHR hopes that those that are exposed to the land rights themed contents of the Human Rights Education Platform will become more active in social change movements and in advocating for their land rights.
