# ECONOMIC SOCIAL & CULTURAL RIGHTS

Economic, social, and cultural rights refer to rights in the workplace, social security, family life, participation in cultural life, as well as access to housing, food, water, healthcare, and education.





Right to participate in cultural life, Art. 15 (a), ICESCR



Education shall enable all persons to participate in a free society, promote understanding, tolerance, Art. 13 (1), ICESCR



Enjoy the benefits of scientific progress and its applications, Art. 15 (1), ICESCR



Right to one's own intellectual property & creative productions, Art. 15, ICESCR




Right not to be subjected to forced assimilation or destruction of their culture, Art. 8 (1), UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People
