Dear Mr. Jaramillo,

We, the undersigned organizations, urge the Global Fund to provide clarity on how it will maintain and expand the implementation of rights-based HIV programs targeting sexual and gender minorities as the institution's reorganization is finalized.

The global HIV epidemic has had a disproportionately heavy burden on sexual and gender minorities, with data showing that men who have sex with men (MSM) and transgender communities are especially hard hit. Despite this, these communities have largely not been prioritized with targeted funding in the global HIV response¹. Where funding sources do exist, recent research indicates that intended HIV investments for MSM undergo attrition at the countrylevel due to a range of structural barriers, including homophobia².

The Global Fund has a long history of constructive action on these issues: In May 2009, the Global Fund's Strategy in Relation to Sexual Orientation and Gender Identities (SOGI Strategy) was approved by the Board³. This strategy is intended to help ensure that investments more effectively reach men who have sex with men, transgender populations, male, female, and transgender sex workers, and women who have sex with women – all with a strong emphasis on evidence-based programs rooted in human rights⁴. In 2010, the MARPs Reserve was established as a mechanism to ensure targeted funding for these populations and people who inject drugs⁵. The Board initially approved US\$ 200 million over five years, of which US\$47 million was awarded in Round 10 for HIV programming in 41 countries over 2 years.

We applaud the work of the Global Fund Secretariat and Board to emphasize portfolio management in the recent reorganization and enshrine human rights as part of the new Global Fund Strategy. However, it remains unclear how the SOGI strategy will be implemented moving forward or who is responsible for that work. A plan that operationalizes the goals of the strategy is desperately needed to ensure the Global Fund's long term success against the three diseases.

We request a public update on the following issues:

- 1. Leadership on the SOGI Strategy within the Global Fund who is responsible for implementing the strategy, monitoring progress and reporting?
- 2. MARPs Reserve How will the Global Fund build upon and replicate the success of the MARPs Reserve to stimulate demand from countries for programs for these populations?
- 3. Human rights How will the human rights components of the Global Fund's strategy be implemented and monitored, particularly those related to non-discrimination, gender equality, accountability and service delivery? (See especially points 25, 73, 74 and 75 in the Global Fund 2012-2016 Strategy).

We look forward to continuing to work in a collaborative manner with the Global Fund to achieve these goals, and stand ready to provide support to the process.
